WORKSTUDIO IMPACT INVESTMENT IN SUSTAINABLE BUSINESS MODELS

In times of low interest rates, the demand for non-financial societal return increases. This workstudio explores how positive social and environmental impact in business models can be identified to assist sustainable investment decision-making. Real case examples will help to identify "impactful" business models.

Description of the workstudio

The workstudio explores means and measures to identify impact investment opportunities that add value to investors. It addresses banks, business angels, foundations, and funds that are looking to make a difference with the assets they manage. Participation also offers an opportunity for companies and entrepreneurs of impact-related products and services.

We will be looking at business model parameters that can tell whether an investment can live up to its impact promises. It enables investors to better target and support the impact investments they and their clients are looking for. Using innovative and engaging techniques, this workstudio aims to develop a sixth sense for impact investments that make a difference in people's lives, safeguard the environment and proof an attractive SROI.

The workstudio will be supported from the Do School (thedoschool.org) that contributes its successful innovation methodology as well as their extensive knowledge on social entrepreneurship.
